Competence and Confidence Partners in Policymaking (C2P2)

The Institute on Disabilities currently offers two C2P2 programs for Pennsylvanians.

In these free training programs, individuals with disabilities and/or family members commit to a series of 2-day sessions throughout the year.

Participants:
—learn the most current information about disability supports policy.
—develop skills to lead, collaborate, and advise.
—are encouraged to share their newly acquired skills and knowledge with others in the community.

- Local and national faculty teach interactive sessions on a variety of relevant topics.
- Applications are reviewed and qualified candidates are selected.
- Travel, childcare and personal assistance reimbursement is available. Meals are included.



Families First

Free information sessions focus on the basics of Early Intervention for families who have infants, toddlers, and pre-schoolers receiving Early Intervention services in Philadelphia.

Participants:

- learn how to be an effective team member for your child's Individual Family Services Plan (IFSP) or Individual Education Plan (IEP).
- network with other families with children who receive services.

C2P2 Early Intervention

Family members in Pennsylvania who have an infant, toddler or pre-school age child with disabilities learn the Early Intervention System, best practices and how to advocate for themselves and others.

C2P2 Emerging and Established Leaders

Emerging Leaders with disabilities, age 18-30, are partnered with an Established Leader with disabilities. The team works together to develop and sharpen their leadership skills. Established Leaders mentor the Emerging Leaders through the process as they complete an internship.
