Viewer Advisory: This film includes archival material that reflects historical language used to describe disability. That language is considered offensive today. Though we recognize the difficulty of this language, it is included because it sheds light on the origins of stigma that has been experienced by people with disabilities.

Entering the Building

Please enter the **Charles Library** using the entrance at the corner of Polett Walk and Liacouras Walk. The Library entrance is accessible. If you use this entrance, you will **not** be asked to show ID.

Restrooms

Transportation

Parking Options

• Liacouras Garage is located at 15th and Cecil B. Moore Ave.

- Tuttleman lot is located on Montgomery Avenue between 13th and 12th streets
- Cecil B. Moore lot, located on Cecil B. Moore Avenue between 12th and 13th streets
- Street parking: There is often free parking available on the well-lit streets surrounding the theater.

Public Transportation

- Bus/Septa: Use the No. 4 or No. 16, which run north and south along Broad Street, or the No. 3, which runs east and west along Cecil B. Moore Avenue between 33rd Street and the Frankford Transportation Center.
- Subway: Use the Broad Street Line (also known as the Orange Line due to the color of the cars) and exiting at the Cecil B. Moore station
- Septa Regional Rail: Take to the Temple University station, which is located at 10th and Berks streets, or the North Broad Street station, which is located at Broad Street and West Huntingdon Street.
- Paratransit: We recommend using the 13th Street address as your drop off/pick up location. You can enter the Library through the 13th street entrance, or travel to the back of the Library and use the Polett Walk entrance.
